STEWART ROAD:

ROAD COMPLETION FROM SR 167 TO THE WHITE RIVER BRIDGE.
PROJECTED COMPLETION IS BY THE END OF 2020.

MILWAUKEE BOULEVARD:

IMPROVEMENTS ON MILWAUKEE BLVD. TO BEGIN THIS SUMMER & WILL INCLUDE SIDEWALKS ON THE EAST SIDE BETWEEN 3RD AVE. S & 4TH AVE. S.

❖ INTERURBAN TRAIL:

PERMITTING & DESIGN OF THE INTERURBAN TRAIL FROM 3RD AVE. SW TO STEWART ROAD COMPLETED IN 2017 WITH CONSTRUCTION OCCURRING IN EARLY TO MID 2018.

NEW PUBLIC WORKS BUILDING:

THE NEW FACILITY WILL ALLOW CITY EQUIPMENT TO BE CENTRALLY LOCATED TO BETTER MAINTAIN THE INFRASTRUCTURE. PROJECT SCHEDULED TO BE COMPLETE IN 2018.

PACIFIC AVENUE:

PACIFIC AVE. BETWEEN ELLINGSON RD. & 3RD AVE. SE WILL BE OVERLAYED IN 2018. THE CITY WILL ALSO BE REPLACING THE ACCESS RAMPS AT INTERSECTIONS.

STATION:

THE CITY IS WORKING TO PREVENT FLOODING IN THE AREAS ADJACENT TO THE WHITE RIVER & CONTINUE TO CONVEY THE SURFACE WATER & STORM DRAINAGE FLOWS IN THE CANAL TO THE WHITE RIVER, WHICH REQUIRES A LARGE STORMWATER PUMP STATION. WITH FUNDING FROM THE KING CO. FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT, THE CITY HAS BEGUN THE PROCESS TO REDUCE POTENTIAL FLOODING FOR THE CITIZENS & BUSINESS IN THE AREA.




