Greetings!

You are probably noticing a lot of activity around the city. We just completed the public input portion of the Right Bank Levy Project of the White River. We hope to begin the design phase of that project this summer, with a project completion slated for 2013. Part of this project will include a pump station located in White River Estates. By now the paving on Pacific Avenue and sidewalks are complete from 3rd Avenue to Ellingson. You may notice a new

signal installed and will be operational any day now on Ellingson and Milwaukee. This greatly improves the safety at that intersection by having a turn signal just like Pacific and Ellingson. That was a long time coming. Frontage Road should be repaired this summer. King County installed a new conveyance system starting in Pacific and that goes into Kent. Once they make the final tie in to the pump house on Frontage, they will repair the part of the road they had to tear up. With the road so bad and people driving on the opposite side of the road to avoid, we felt slowing down traffic will be much safer for our citizens.

The city has been working on updating our website, this should be up and running in the next couple weeks. This site will be more user friendly and truly highlight all the great qualities of our city. Our new website is also going to help entice new business to our city. You may have noticed lots of activity along Valentine and the Shell station going in on the corner of Stewart and Valentine. With the completion of the road projects, development is beginning. We are working hard to attract businesses that will benefit our community. Our city is changing, and with the dedication of our volunteers on the **Park Board and our Planning Commission**, I believe it is for the better. PUBLIC WORKS

Summertime, and the Living is Easy

Summer is soon upon us. There will be construction activities going on this summer in Pacific:

- Pacific Avenue between Ellingson Road and 3rd Avenue SE Overlay. This project includes some sidewalk repairs.
- The City will be replacing all water meter meters later this summer.

If you drive on Pacific Avenue, you have experienced the rough condition of the roadway. The City was awarded a grant from the Transportation Improvement Board in 2016 to make repairs to the road and replace the ADA ramps at the intersections to meet current regulations. The contractor is also replacing sections of the sidewalk that were unsettled, creating potential hazards for pedestrians, as well as, replacing curbing to improve drainage. These improvements should be completed by early summer.

The new water meters will increase the level of accuracy in meter reads. The current meters are several years old. Studies show that the longer a meter has been in service, the more likely it is to wear out and read lower than is correct. These lower reads then indicate that the water system is losing too much water per State requirements. After the new meters are installed, we will be able to recalculate our water losses.



If you have a digging project on your property you need to contact the *Utilities Underground Location Center*. When you make the <u>free</u> call to 811 a few days



before you dig, you'll help prevent unintended consequences such as injury to you or your family, damage to your property, utility service outages to the entire neighborhood and potential fines and repair costs.

The Utility Notification Center is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Locate requests are accepted over the phone, by fax or through an internet request. The King and Pierce County locate phone number is: 1-800-424-5555 (or 811).





General Fund Trends thru April: 2015-2018

The General Fund is the single most important fund for every City. It is the fund that contains resources that have yet to be committed that may be used for general purposes. All activity that has not been assigned to a specific fund is accounted for in the General Fund.





Since 2015 the General Fund balance as of April has increased by over 60%! This is significantly due to proper budgeting and responsible managing of expenditures.



COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

New Sumner-Pacific Manufacturing Industrial Center (MIC) Subarea Plan



In April of 2017, the Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) gave provisional approval of the Sumner-Pacific MIC (See map). As a condition of the approval, the cities of Sumner & Pacific were required to adopt a new Subarea Plan for the area. The MIC Subarea is intended to protect properties in both cities for industrial land uses. The MIC Subarea Plan review process is now nearing completion with recommendations to both City's Planning Commissions and Councils. Review for the Pacific Planning Commission is for May 2018 with City Council review in June and July.
